COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PARK BOARD:

LIBRARY BOARD:

Jody said the additional parking in the lot they purchased adjacent to the library has worked out really well.

FIRE BOARD REPORT:

Joe said they had 1 structure fires, 2 power line standbys, 2 misc. calls, 2 false alarm, and 26 E.M.S. responses in September. Their next meeting is November 3 at Millington.

BUILDING INSPECTOR'S REPORT:

Tim Anderson said there were 7 building, 1 electrical, 1 plumbing, and 1 mechanical permit issued in September. The valuation was \$82,000.00. The building permits consisted of additions and pole buildings.

WORK PROJECTS REPORT:

POLICE REPORT:

Deputy Rogner said we had 0 property crime, 0 assaults, 6 general non-criminal assistance, 2 traffic complaints, 1 accident and 6 other complaints. Complaints handled by the township's two officers was 15, non-Arbela sheriff's patrol was 24 and state police 7. He said they had 75 property inspections, and a total of 39 complaints. They made 3 arrests, 2 of which were drunk drivers.

SENIOR SOCIAL CLUB

Our spaghetti dinner was last week. Joe said we grossed \$950.25. There were 98 meals served and the rest of the money came from the silent auction and some cash donations. NEW BUSINESS:

MOTION: By Warren to pay our contribution to the Arthur Latham Park in the amount of \$10,000.00.

The costs on the Lewis Road project between Barnes and Millington Roads came in at \$26,993.17 over what the road commission estimated it would cost. Warren said all we can do is pay the road commission what we have budgeted for this year and the remainder will have to be paid in the next budget year. The road commission is ok with this as it was their mistake.

MOTION: By Warren to pay the Tuscola County Road Commission \$104,539.13, which is what we have left in our road budget.

The road commission just finished paving Belsay Road from Birch Run to Barnes Rd. Once they paint the white lines on the sides of Belsay Road and Buell Road our road work will be complete for 2009.
